#### Synopsis of tenure:

In my short tenure at NNU, I have been responsible for restarting the primary instrumental ensembles. In 2021, we started a chamber orchestra that, in addition to performing independently, collaborates with the University Choir (UCO) and principal wind and percussionists (Symphony Orchestra). Both Wind Ensemble and Chamber Orchestra have grown in quality and repertoire. In 2022, I evaluated and proposed an updated music education curriculum, which was accepted in 2023. In addition, I have collaborated with music colleagues to refine processes and practices within the music department (including juries, assessments, accreditation, and curricular redesign). Finally, I continue to work with the School of Education for placements and support our music education students through advising and guidance of the local collegiate chapter of NAfME.

Synopsis of tenure:	

Over my five years, the Point Loma HS music program grew from a single band of 30 students into a fully functioning music program involving over 200 students. This expansion included hiring an additional music teacher, the addition of seven music groups and course offerings, and the planning and capital campaign for the construction of a \$1.2 million music center (opened in 2012). The ensembles quickly rose to high levels with annual recording projects, regional tours, and the establishment of a yearly gala performance, entitled "Rhapsody on the Point".
